

INTRODUCTION

Welcome to the Soccerex 20 U21 report 2019 - the fifth edition - created in partnership with Prime Time Sport, using their Football Value Index valuation methodology.

This summer has seen many of the world's top young players in action, either in the UEFA U21 European Championships or representing their National sides in the UEFA Nations League, Copa America, Gold Cup or African Cup of Nations.

Increasingly, clubs across Europe's big leagues are putting their faith in youth, with many of our top 20 making the breakthrough into their club's first teams in the past 12 months. We have also seen U21 talent like Matthijs de Ligt and Trent Alexander-Arnold lighting up the later stages of the UEFA Champions League.

We finished last year's report speculating whether Kylian Mbappé might become Real Madrid's next Galactico and in the process set a transfer record... Well, Mbappé stayed put, but his meteoric rise has continued at PSG and he has become the first player to break the €200m barrier in our report, topping this year's rankings with a value of €261.6m. As Messi and Ronaldo's careers enter their twilight, the era of Mbappé as the world's biggest star is surely just around the corner.

FOOTBALL VALUE INDEX

The Football Value Index by Prime Time Sport is a best-inclass player valuation methodology, used by football clubs and the sport industry, to obtain an independent and accurate valuation of football players. Clubs need to know the real value of their main asset, the squad. The accounting value may differ significantly from this, so there are many situations when football clubs need the most accurate valuation of players or squads.

We hope that this product helps the football industry to be more efficient. The main usages are in transfers (to help in the decision process and in negotiations), in M&A processes, in equity (when a significant difference between the accounting value vs the real value can affect the equity position of the club), to make a rational value allocation for insurance, to provide real and relevant information to investors, and to set guarantees in loans and other financial products.



PRINCIPLES

AT-PRESENT PRINCIPLE

The player valuation is made bearing in mind both personal attributes and pitch performance, using player's current personal information and the performances of both the current season and the previous one.

RELIABILITY PRINCIPLE

Objective and contrasted sources are used for the performance of this report; the Football Transfer Review report by Prime Time Sport, FIFA stats and other sources.

INDEPENDENCY PRINCIPLE

Due to an internal methodology and the sources used in the project, independent results and objective valuation are guaranteed.

SCOPE

Players born on or after January 1st 1998.

METHODOLOGY

FOR EACH PLAYER. WE RESEARCHED

CURRENT CLUB AVERAGE PLAYER SALE VALUE

The origin club affects the player value.

CURRENT CLUB "STANDARD" PLAYER ANALYSIS

Analysis of the current club's "standard" player sold in the last 5 years provides data to adjust weights for the PTS Rating Index.

COMPARABLE CLUBS AVERAGE SELLING PLAYER VALUE

Calculation of average value of the last 5 years transfers performed by comparable clubs.

MARKET VALUE PERCEPTION

Popular transfer sites and press information can affect the player's value, and have to be considered.

POSITION ON THE PITCH OF EACH PLAYER

The average transfer paid (excluding temporary sessions and free transfers for ending contracts) per position of ALL transfers made in the 5 major leagues (UK, SP, IT, DE, FR) in the past summer transfer window shows demand for different positions.

PTS RATING INDEX

FOR EACH PLAYER, WE ANALYSED

NATIONAL TEAM APPEARANCES

This aims to reflect the importance of a player and represents an objective variable to assess performance.

GOALS SCORED

An analysis of goals scored, weighted per position on the pitch.

INJURIES

The player's value is affected by how prone they are to injury.

MEDIA VALUE

Assessed by the PTS Sports Marketing team.

TECHNICAL QUALITY

An essential factor in a player's valuation.








CONCLUSIONS

The most high-profile transfer of the summer so far has undoubtedly been Eden Hazard's the much-touted move to Real Madrid, for a reported fee of €100m. Hazard will be joining three of the players from this year's Soccerex 20 U21 Report at Los Blancos, with Rodrygo and Eder Militao joining Vinicius Junior in a restructured squad where increasingly the emphasis is on youth; these three young stars have also been joined by Serbian striker Luka Jovic, who was signed for €60m and who would have featured in this report but, having turned 21 on 23rd December 1997, he misses out on the criteria for our top 20 by a matter of days!

Hazard's transfer means that Kylian Mbappé looks to be staying put for another year at least and so speculation of what Real Madrid – or any other club – might have to pay for him will remain just that (speculation) for now. The Soccerex 20 Under 21 Report 2019 values the French superstar at €261.6m based on a methodology that evaluates performance factors such as minutes played, goals scored and international appearances in the context of wider environmental factors such as age, length of contract and quality of current club.

One thing is for certain. If, as seems likely, he moves to a Spanish or English heavyweight in the years to come, our report indicates his fee will be a record breaking one!

João Félix, the buy out that bucks the trend

Of the top 20, four players have transferred since the start of the year and three* of the four have moved for a fee within €5m of our valuation, highlighting the reliability of our model. The outlier is Portuguese wonderkid João Félix, who based on data prior to 1st July we have valued at €71.8m. That Atletico were willing to pay Benfica the €120m required to trigger his buyout clause is a reflection of his undoubted talent and the willingness of Europe's elite, fuelled by broadcast and Champions League revenues, to spend big on potential rather than his actual market value.

*Rodrygo's fee was agreed in the summer of 2018 when we valued him at €40m.

The rare number 9

For the first time, there are no out-and-out strikers in our report, although Italian front men Patrick Cutrone and Moise Kean are just outside the top 20. Genuine goal scorers – so important to a team's success - are a rare commodity and often it takes players time to make a success of or adapt to the position. It is worth noting that some of the most prolific forwards of the modern era such as Thierry Henry, Cristiano Ronaldo and Lionel Messi all started out as wingers before being converted into strikers. Mbappé is in a similar mould, having played for both club and country as the main striker, as well as out wide and, as his career develops, could well become the epitome of the new number 9.

The rising value of defence

Our methodology reflects the market principle that position affects value. In each edition there have been more attacking players than defensive ones but, this year, although the number of defensive players (i.e. defenders and goalkeepers) featuring is similar to previous editions, we have a higher concentration at the top end of the report, with two in the top 5 and four in the top 10. Leading the way are Matthijs de Ligt and Trent Alexander-Arnold who, after successful UEFA Champions League campaigns, both saw their values increase by over €20m from 2018. With de Ligt young enough to feature next year, and with rumours of a big money move on the horizon, he could become the first defender to top our list.

England on top

Despite a poor showing at this summer's UEFA U21 European Championships, England is the leading nation represented with six players in the top 20, double the amount from last year. The talent that led the country to victory in the FIFA U17 and U20 World Cups has started to see their potential realised, with many

gaining first team playing time over the past 12 months. None more so than Jadon Sancho whose transfer to Borussia Dortmund paid off spectacularly with the winger becoming one of the most exciting and prolific chance-creators in European football at just 19 years of age. England's dominance of the report looks set to continue with five of the six young enough to feature again next year.

France is the second most represented nation with four players, then Brazil with three, Italy with two and then one each for Portugal, Netherlands, USA, Germany and Nigeria. For the first time there are no Spanish players but LaLiga can now boast five of the top 20, following the moves of Joao Felix, Rodrygo and Eder Militao to Atletico Madrid and Real Madrid from SL Benfica, Santos and FC Porto respectively this summer.

The Premier League is the most represented league with six players – and this is excluding Christian Pulisic, whose ranking is based on his time at Borussia Dortmund. Of the other "Big Five" European leagues, the Bundesliga have four players in the report and Serie A and Ligue 1 both have two.

Youth market - stagnation or normalization?

The overall value of our top 20 has increased by 5.8% YoY and the value of the top 5 has increased by 16.5%. This pales in comparison to last year when the overall value went up by 66% and the top 5 by a whopping 73%. In one light, this reduction in the rate of growth could appear to indicate a stagnation in the value of U21 players – particularly in the context of the overall YoY growth experienced in 2017 (62%) – but, in truth, the sharp rises in 2017 and 2018 were fuelled by vast revenues from the record-breaking Premier League broadcasting rights deal that began in 2017 and the paradigm shift caused by PSG triggering Neymar's huge buyout clause in 2018. The values in this year's report represent more a market normalization where, without the impact of extreme external forces, values have increased at a more measured rate in line with overall market trends.

It is also worth noting that in 2018, there was a greater percentage of players featuring in the report for the final year – nine in 2018 compared with just five in 2019 – and so "peaking" in terms of their report valuation. It will be interesting to see just how much the appreciation in value of the 15 eligible to feature again next year will mitigate the loss of Kylian Mbappé, who, under our methodology having been born in 1998, will not be eligible for the 2020 report.
